On 4 March 2014 I attending a meeting of Ex Service Organisation leaders in Canberra prior to the Ex Service Round Table meeting the following day, the main purpose of this meeting was to consolidate some agreement on policy directions we want to raise with the Minister and DVA departmental heads the next day. The meeting was positive and we were able to reach agreement on a joint approach to government on a number of subjects.

Through the VVAA ACT Branch contacts with the Australian War Memorial I was able to accept a donation of a number of books that commemorated the dedication of the Vietnam War Memorial in Canberra, copies will be made available to states at the National Council in May, if anyone wants copies earlier please contact me

During the month I was invited to a meeting with two Timorese representatives of their freedom fighters veterans association, the meeting was exploratory on their part with a view to establishing links with veterans associations in Australia that could assist them in establishing compensation and health support services for their members, early days however the contact has been made.
